Notice to All Pool Contractors

Re: Pool Contractors / Total Dynamic Head Pressure

Beginning March 1, 2008, all residential pools must comply with the 2007 Florida Building Code Residential, which references standard ANSI/APSP-7. This standard requires a calculation of the Total Dynamic Head Pressure. The pool contractor of record may use a calculation worksheet, which will be available online and in the Building Department office. If you choose to use another method of calculation, signed and sealed engineering data to support those calculations must be provided.

Please note that all blanks, which pertain to the calculation, must be filled in, by the contractor. Also, the manufacture's cut sheet(s) for the pump, filter and main drain specified on the form, must be provided along with the worksheet at the time of permitting.

The worksheet will become part of the approved plan and must be at the job site for inspections. Additionally, a gauge must be provided on both the pressure and suction side of the system, at the time of the final inspection. The suction side gauge can be removed by the contractor after the final inspection has been approved.
